# What's in your hand?

In Exodus 3, God calls Moses into leadership of His people in response to the exploitation and abuse of the Israelites under Pharaoh's hand. God assured Moses of a glorious ultimate outcome...and He chose Moses to spearhead it all. We can imagine Moses' jaw dropping in stunned disbelief.

Never mind that Moses was having a conversation with the Creator and had just seen a unique miracle; he probably thought, *"Great plan, Lord...with someone else, someone better skilled than I; that should be an easy switch."* God would have none of that. He might have said, *"No worries, Mo'—I've got this covered."* But Moses clearly thought he had nothing to offer God.

Knowing this, God, in Exodus 4:2, asked Moses, *"What is that in your hand?"* (NIV) to which he replied, *"A staff."* He probably wanted to add, *"A not-so-great staff, a beat-up staff, a useless piece of wood actually; it's mine, I need it, and how on Earth has it anything to do with our problem?"* Then God tested him, telling him to throw it on the ground, and miracles followed...from 'just a staff'.

Recently, a Canadian OMer working in Japan struggled to feel useful especially when her ability to speak Japanese was limited. How would she ever befriend women neighbours, let alone be a witness to them? While in prayer, God asked her, *"What's in your hand? Stop thinking about what you don't have; what do you have that we together can use?"* All she could think of was her simple bread oven, so she began baking loaves and delivering them as gifts. And God was pleased to open doors to the community through that simple and perhaps desperate act of faith.

## The glass is waiting to be filled

Blame it on advertising or our self-absorbed culture or an anemic untested faith, but too many of us live as if we believe that God has given us little or nothing to use to bring Him honour around us and around the world. Let's stop that, now. We all to varying degrees lack time and money and talent and insight and connections and whatever else we think are essential for building God's kingdom. It's no excuse for not using what we do have;

if we mean business, God is ready to transform our offerings.

It all comes down to what we value as priorities, and how we allot our energies and resources accordingly. **Take time** (to pray for missions, to mentor others, to volunteer and so much more): The same people who moan at being too busy also moan about boredom. So you don't have an hour to kill? What about 15 minutes to actually pray, or time enough to send an encouraging note to a worker abroad? What about investing time to learn the realities of world missions today rather than binging on a TV series?

**Or take money:** You might already feel squeezed, but setting aside \$10/week from your entertainment budget for the needy means over \$500/year! Think about that. **Got talent?** Yes you do, so find a way to volunteer with a mission like OM and watch it flourish in something that matters. What's in your hand? Give it back to God.

# Nepal Earthquake Mercy Appeal Update



The devastating 7.8 magnitude earthquake that shook Nepal last year meant, for millions, the loss of loved ones, homes and livelihoods. Yet, because of the generosity of many Canadians and others, people have felt supported and dare to hope again. Thank you for making a difference in the name of Jesus!

Following initial emergency relief, the reconstruction of people's homes has been the focus of OM's long-term development strategy. One model home has already been built to showcase the strength and quality of the proposed new houses and give locals the skills to build their own homes in the same way.

Using local porters and mules to ferry construction materials allows them to earn income, rebuild their homes, livelihoods and self-esteem.

Finances raised through the generosity of OM partners will enable the whole Langtang village—116 families—to be rebuilt.

OMers have shared about Jesus with many community members on an individual basis.

Over 100 OM workers were immediately

mobilized to minister to those in need. OM teams have distributed essential aid to over 50,000 people in 109 villages of the hardest hit areas—nearly 23 tonnes of food as well as tarps, roofing sheets, blankets, towels, insulation foam stoves and more.

Vocational training and child trauma camps were also provided as part of rehabilitating people. Training in plumbing and electricity, jewellery making and English speaking invested many men and women with skills to provide for their families' needs.

Throughout the process, OM has worked in close partnership with village communities, churches where they exist and government. This has provided us with much experience and more opportunities for relationships as our reputation as a capable and honest organization grows. Thank you!



Across North Africa, remains of ancient cathedrals and empty church buildings testify to pre-Islamic Christian influence. Locals treasure traditions not linked to Islam, remembering the rituals but not the reasons behind them.

Long-term workers Candace\* and Michael\* befriended one man in a remote village. Omar\* set up an in-house museum and restaurant to honour traditional items and cuisine.

## EVANGELISM

When the couple first visited Omar's village, he showed them around his home. Above one door, Candace noticed an interesting symbol: two hands placed between three triangular points. Omar explained the room had been used for prayer. Candace asked about the three triangles. *"It's what you people call the Trinity,"* Omar replied.

They noticed other symbols related to Christianity, such as bridal veils with tie-dyed red circles forming a cross.

On a subsequent visit near Easter, Omar told about a celebration the following Sunday. *"It's a festival where children go around the village waving palm branches,"* he said. Realising the significance, Candace told him the Palm Sunday story. *"I've got it in a book. Would you like one?"* she asked. Omar said yes, so Candace fetched the Arabic-French Bible in her car.

When Candace and Michael again visited, they ordered a meal from Omar's restaurant and walked up the hill to a nearby mosque. They heard the call to prayer rumble from another

mosque, but the one near to them remained silent.

They asked Omar why the mosque near his house hadn't sounded the prayer call. The Imam couldn't be bothered to walk up the hill five times a day, Omar told them. This concerned Omar less than that the same Imam relieved himself in front of Omar's house on his way down from the mosque. *"Why should I go there?"* he asked Candace and Michael. *"The Imam doesn't speak to me, and he urinates in front of my house."*

Furthermore, Omar complained that one time he had attended the mosque, the Imam criticised him for placing his left foot inside before his right foot. *"God doesn't care about these things, does He?"* he wondered to the couple. *"God cares about the heart, doesn't He?"*

Pray for Omar and other locals in remote villages—that that the truth behind their traditions would lead them to a knowledge of Jesus.



## Macedonia

Christina (USA) previously worked with OM in Kosovo but, even after several years back home, she could not ignore the Balkins refugee crisis. Returning this year as a volunteer, she spent months with OM teams working with refugees in Serbia and writes from Macedonia about the OM team in action:

'Helping with the refugee crisis' has become synonymous with humanitarian aid, and the flood of refugees into Europe demanded drastic relief efforts. However, seeing a person as an object in need strips away much of their identity as a human being.

When the massive camp at the Macedonian-Greek border was full, OM stepped in to serve. Their goal has been not just meeting immediate necessities of refugees, but restoring their dignity and worth as God's creation.

Taking food and clothing was a means of introduction, with the purpose of building long-term relationships.



Day after day, they would sit with people, enter into their stories and offer the True Hope as a source of life. Not knowing the future of borders opened and closed, they remained faithful in this ministry for three months.

In May, the Greek authorities closed the camp and distributed its refugees throughout makeshift camps in the north of Greece. Most are abandoned warehouses now filled with tents and

## Israel

For years, OM has focused on growing and empowering churches in the neediest regions. True followers of Jesus face spiritual opposition and social ostracism. Some have a difficulty finding employment, or their children are discriminated against in education.

OM has narrowed its focus. *"Looking at the Jezreel Valley, our goal is that those who hear the gospel can be brought together to worship and reproduce disciples. In its 120 communities, there is only one small church that we know of,"* the Field Leader said. Local believers appreciate the support that long-term OMers provide and value their fellowship. *"When we first came to our church, we came not as leaders but to be alongside them."*

the most basic necessities. In an effort to continue relationships, OM located the camps where all the families had been placed and tried to gain access. God has opened a door for them to continue to love and support about ten families several times a week. They bring vegetables, clothes, and other needed items, but most of all they come to listen, to share tears, and to allow these families to feel normal for a few hours every week.

Team leader Lindsay\* regularly attends an Arab congregation. *“The fact that I went there every Sunday was a testament and encouragement to them,”* she said. *“To have a foreigner invested in your church and participating is a huge deal,”* she said. *“We can encourage the local body. For a Messianic to evangelise means a higher risk of persecution,”* Lindsay said. To the Field Leader, “People recognize that Gentile believers play a huge

role in the advancement of the gospel and the establishment of the church,” he said.

The OM team remains focused on working with established churches and planting more congregations among the unreached.

*“We aren’t just looking for people to hear about Jesus. We want them to become part of a vibrant group of worshipping people,”* he said.



Josh typically splits his time equally between all the players assigned to him. This year, however, God provided ample time for conversation with one individual. They discussed how Christianity is more than just a belief; it is the source of a person’s identity. Another highlight for Josh was connecting with more coaches and staff than in previous years.

*“This year I spoke with them a lot,”* said Josh, *“which can be valuable because they spend more time with these boys than I ever will.”*

*“Interacting with players and coaches shows how important sport chaplaincy is,”* Josh shared. *“Even at the age of 18, they go through a lot to play on these teams. Their life is consumed by rugby, so*

## South Africa

An under-18 provincial rugby tournament every July in Durban draws the best rugby players from all over the country to a weeklong competition that is a unique opportunity for ministry. Sport for Christ Action South Africa (SCAS) has sent teams to the tournament for over 20 years, serving players with the love of Christ practically and spiritually. For the past two years, OM SportsLink has joined them their efforts.

*“Events like this are important for SportsLink because elite athletes are sometimes forgotten in ministry,”* explained Josh Herb, OM South Africa SportsLink leader. *“These are some of the best players in South Africa, so their identity is in rugby alone. For one week, we can show them that there is more to life than rugby—that Jesus desires a relationship with them.”*



*when we love them it stirs up something within them: That there is more to life than rugby.”* the Lord for open doors throughout the tournament to talk with the players and staff. Pray that the seeds planted will be nurtured and grow.

# OM CHALLENGES in Canada:

The OM Canadian Challenges are our response to the massive influx of immigrants, particularly Muslims, Hindus and Sikhs, and to the pervasive secular humanism in our society. We see these as great opportunities to provide cross-cultural training in the heart of our urban areas.

Canadian Challenges are one-week programs that train believers in sharing their faith clearly, confidently and cross-culturally. Each day is balanced with classroom learning, visits to a religious site in the afternoon, and neighbourhood visitation (preferably in multicultural areas) in the evening. We learn by doing—the OM way of serving and growing.

Our goal is to love internationals (and everyone else) into God's Kingdom by learning (about their worldviews), listening (to them, often using a survey), serving (perhaps cleaning up their neighbourhood) and sharing the Good News of salvation in Jesus and how He has changed our lives. We challenge team members to make evangelism their lifestyle.

We challenge Canadian believers to move out of their comfort zones and become a missionary for a week, without a passport or possibly even a ticket. Are you up for the Challenge?

## 2016 at a glance

Spring and summer 2016 saw eight one-week Challenges from Ontario to B.C.\* These involved 136 full-time and 61 part-time team members ranging in age from teens to seniors.

Each morning included cross-cultural training in evangelism, teaching on major world religions (Islam, Hinduism, Buddhism, Sikhism, Judaism and Secular Humanism) and hearing testimonies from people who came to faith from those religious backgrounds. Each afternoon the team visited a religious site (such as a mosque, temple, gurdwara or synagogue). Each evening the team put their learning into practice by visiting people in multi-cultural neighbourhoods to share their faith using a survey, gospel presentations, their testimony, the *Jesus* DVD (in multiple languages), gospel booklets and a host church pamphlet.

Pray for continued fruit from these outreaches by participating churches.



# Philippines



APRIL 11–29 • APPLY BY: FEB 13



Reaching out to the Batak and Tagbanua tribes of Palawan Province, Go Extra Mile is a 17–day intensive missions training and exposure program that provides each participant with knowledge, attitudes, and skills necessary to be effective witnesses, coupled with hands-on missions' exposure among a tribal group.

During the first five days, participants will learn skills in evangelism, the biblical basis on missions, spiritual transformation, team building and more. They will have the opportunity to minister among churches in Palawan, followed by a four-day tribal youth camp. Teams will disperse to different outreaches in the area. There will be a tour to the famous Palawan Underground River. Living conditions will be basic and there will be considerable walking and trekking in tribal areas.



## Logos Hope



APRIL 12–JULY 18 • APPLY BY FEB 13

The S.T.E.P. (Short-Term Exposure Program) is a unique opportunity for young people to serve God on board Logos Hope. Living and working alongside people from different nations gives firsthand experience of what it takes to be a cross-cultural Christian worker. Days will be filled with practical work in one of the ship's departments (40hrs per week/ 8hrs per day). Outreach Teams are one day per week; you will participate in an assigned ministry experience either onboard or onshore. In three months, you will visit several ports and be stretched in capacity, making friends for life.

## Belgium

Easter Outreach: Stations of the Cross is an artistic representation of Christ's last hours before His death and resurrection. By using the arts, we will bring this significant event to life and use it to share the impact that His sacrifice has had on our lives and for all.

Participants should be able to stand and walk for long periods of time as we engage Belgians and others on the streets. # Rivers of Europe:

## a pathway for the gospel

*Vessel pictured is an example only*

The vast river network of Europe connects many of its major cities, as well as hundreds of towns and villages from the North Sea to the Black Sea. We hope to operate a river-going vessel to share the gospel and mobilize the Church to see vibrant communities of Jesus followers among the least reached.

We plan to charter a vessel for a three-month trial period at the end of 2017. The vessel will sail down the Rhine River, visiting various ports in the Netherlands and Germany. We will berth the boat in strategic locations close to city centres for two weeks and invite people aboard to experience a programme of events. We also plan to invest in our crew, by offering training on board in practical ministry skills.

We will share this inspirational space with local churches, motivating them to further their work after our departure.

### The vessel

The vessel will accommodate 100 people with storage for materials and equipment used in ministry. Several ministry spaces will host OM's Global Village simulation, where guests encounter a broken world face-to-face and interact with those in it, challenging them to reflect Jesus in difficult situations.

The vessel will also offer an onboard conference facility for 100 people, allowing us to host various groups for evangelistic and mission-mobilizing events. A shop and café which will attract the public, offer space to relax and have conversations with our crew.

We are building an international team of 80 people to help with this project from September to December 2017. # Partnership is a journey

**Serving my local church for over 15 years, I understood the importance of having a vision for the community in which you live.** The immediate need is in front of you on a regular basis, so global issues can feel far away. I can help immediate needs because I can physically see the result.

Many friends serving in missions would come and speak at our church. Their stories were inspiring, challenging...and sometimes uncomfortable. We would take an offering and off they would go. We didn't do much but would tell ourselves, "We did our part in supporting our missionary". Our friends were always grateful, but I always thought: 'How can we build stronger connections with our friends and the ministry they are involved with? There must be more to the relationship than this!

I have now been serving with OM for eight years and still ask the same question: "How can we build stronger connections with the local church?" The answer is PARTNERSHIPS. I would love to see every church in Canada adopt a country, people group, project or national worker. As Operation Mobilization in Canada, we want to see vibrant communities of Jesus followers among the least reached, but we can only do this as we connect people and churches, like you, with our ministries and workers around the world. Does your church have a vision and passion for the least reached in your community? Do you know that there are still over 3,000 people groups who have yet to hear the good news of Jesus?

The church and missions culture has changed over the past 20 years. Technology, social issues, post-Christianity, people movements throughout the world have all had an impact on our churches. We, as the church, still want to do our part...but
